Samples also provide patients with the convenience of one-stop shopping, said **Dr. Hema A. Sundaram**, a dermatologist in suburban Washington. "Usually a patient has waited some time to see a doctor and rearranged their whole working schedule, and then it may be another four or five days before they can fill a prescription," she said. "They're often busy, working people, with family responsibilities. I feel there shouldn't be any further delay."
